## INSTRUCTIONAL ARRANGEMENTS HOMEBOUND INSTRUCTION

## **PROPOSED REVISIONS**

GENERAL EDUCATION	Consistent with TEA's Student Attendance Accounting Handbook (SAAH), a student to be confined for a minimum of four weeks to a hospital or homebound for medical reasons specifically document- ed by a physician licensed to practice in the United States may be eligible for general education homebound services. The request for services shall be made through the principal in accordance with TEA's SAAH and administrative procedures.
	The principal or designee shall convene a placement committee composed of at least a campus administrator, a teacher of the stu- dent, and the parent, guardian, or other person having authority to make educational decisions for the student or the student, if the student is 18 years or older or is an emancipated minor, (or the adult student in lieu thereof) to consider the necessity of providing general education homebound instruction to the student. If the committee determines that such instruction is appropriate, the committee shall determine the type and amount of instruction to be provided and, when the student is able to return to the regular edu- cational setting, the length of the transition period based on current medical information.
SPECIAL EDUCATION	For special education students, the ARD committee shall determine the type and amount of instruction to be provided and, when the student is able to return to the regular educational setting, the length of the transition period based on current medical infor- mation.
DOCUMENTATION OF SERVICES	The District shall maintain, in accordance with administrative pro- cedures, full documentation about students receiving homebound services.
