

PROPOSED REVISIONS

UIL ACTIVITIES	State Board and UIL rules shall govern interscholastic activities; however, Board policies and District rules may supplement State Board and UIL rules.
	No event shall be scheduled and no student allowed to participate in any UIL event unless all pertinent rules and regulations are strictly enforced. The Superintendent or designee shall maintain all necessary records and reports. Sponsors and coaches are responsible for knowledge of and compliance with rules for eligibility and participation. [See FM]
ATHLETIC PROGRAM	<p>A well-rounded program of interscholastic athletics shall be maintained in the District secondary schools. The operation of the total program, including the starting and ending dates for each sport, shall be in accordance with regulations set by the UIL and the Board. For additional information refer to <u><i>The Athletic Program Handbook</i></u>, available at the athletic program office.</p> <p>Supervision of the program shall be the responsibility of the Superintendent, but certain responsibilities may be delegated to other staff members. In each school, the principal shall have direct responsibility to maintain the athletic program as an integral part of the educational program of that school.</p> <p>Interscholar competitive athletics shall not be part of the elementary grades' program. To the extent practicable, a program of intra-school sports activities for elementary students shall be maintained as part of the physical education program.</p>
NON-UIL ACTIVITIES	Contests and competitive activities that are sponsored by outside organizations shall not be recommended to students unless the activities supplement and do not interfere with the regular school program. Contests and competitive activities shall have the prior approval of the Superintendent or designee, who shall develop the necessary rules and regulations to implement this policy. [See FM]
CHEERLEADING SAFETY	Beginning in the 2001-02 school year, cheerleader stunting shall be permitted to allow District high school cheerleading squads to be competitive with other high school cheerleading squads. The stunting shall be subject to the safety guidelines endorsed by the American Association of Cheerleading Coaches and Advisors, and any further guidelines as may be implemented by the administration.
EVENTS SCHEDULED ON SUNDAYS	Athletics and other school functions shall not be scheduled under school supervision on Sundays.
