- 1.0 CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE) COURSE DURING HIGH SCHOOL Technology (1.0 credit at any grade level to include courses from the following: any career and technology course.)

Alternative Local Graduation Requirements for Certain Individuals An individual who entered grade 9 before the 2011–12 school year and meets the requirements of Education Code 28.02541(a) [see EIF(LEGAL)] may be awarded a high school diploma if the local graduation committee determines that the individual has demonstrated proficiency in the content areas related to the assessments on which the individual has not performed satisfactorily.
