EI (REGULATION)

TRANSFERRING YEAR-LONG COURSES WITH NO CREDIT When a student enrolls and submits an official transcript from an accredited school that does not award semester credit for a year-long course, student will be enrolled in the second semester of the course and:

If student transferred a grade of 60 or higher and subsequently earns a passing grade of 70 or higher, the District shall award the student credit for both semesters if the average of the grades for the first semester and the second semester is 70 or higher [See EI LOCAL]

If the student transfers a grade of 59 or below, student shall be required to retake only the semester in which the student earned the failing grade. [See EI LOCAL]

TRANSFERRING HIGH SCHOOL COURSES TAKEN IN MIDDLE SCHOOL WITH NO CREDIT When a student enrolls and submits an official transcript from an accredited school that does not award credit for a high school course taken in middle school, a grade of "P" will be awarded. The grade of "P" will not be used in computing the student's grade point average (GPA) and class rank.
