Grade 1	In grade 1, promotion to the next grade level shall be based on a student demonstrating "approaching proficient" or "proficient" for all subject areas. <b>OTHER FACTORS</b> For students not demonstrating "approaching proficient" or "proficient" for all subject areas, a grade placement committee (GPC) shall convene to determine proper placement for the student. Factors to consider can include academic growth, response to intervention (RTI), and the best interest of the student.

	1. The student achieving an overall average of 70 percent or above based on a scale 100 in all classes; or		
	2. The student demonstrating proficiency in both reading and mathematics on the State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness (STAAR).		
	<b>OTHER FACTORS</b> For students not achieving an overall average of 70 on a scale of 100, or not demonstrating proficiency in both the reading and mathematics on the STAAR, a grade placement committee (GPC) shall convene to determine proper placement for the student. Factors to consider can include academic growth, re- sponse to intervention (RTI), and the best interest of the student.		
<del>Grades 5 and 8</del>	In grades 5 and 8, promotion to the next grade level shall be based upon the student demonstrating proficiency in reading and mathe- matics on the STAAR.		
	For students not demonstrating proficiency in both the reading and mathematics on the STAAR, a grade placement committee (GPC) shall convene to determine proper placement for the student. Fac- tors to consider can include academic growth, response to inter- vention (RTI), and the best interest of the student.		
Grades 9–12	Grade-level advancement for students in grades 9–12 shall be earned by course credits. [See EI]		
Accelerated Instruction	If a student fails to demonstrate proficiency on a state-mandated assessment, the student shall be provided accelerated instruction in accordance with state law. Additionally, students in grades 5 and 8 shall be subject to all provisions of Grade Advancement Testing, below.		
<del>Grade Advancement</del> <del>Testing</del>	Except when a student will be assessed in reading or mathematics above his or her enrolled grade level, students in grades 5 and 8 must meet the passing standard on the applicable state-mandated assessments in reading and mathematics to be promoted to the next grade level, in addition to the District's local standards for mastery and promotion.		

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#### EIE (LOCAL)

<del>Definition of</del> <del>"Parent"</del>	For purposes of this policy and decisions related to grade advance- ment requirements, a student's "parent" shall be defined to include either of the student's parents or guardians; a person designated by the parent, by means of a power of attorney or an authorization agreement as provided in Chapter 34 of the Family Code, to have responsibility for the student in all school-related matters [see FD]; a surrogate parent acting on behalf of a student with a disability; or if a person designated by the parent, guardian, or designee cannot be located, a person designated by the Superintendent or de- signee to act on behalf of the student. [See EIE(LEGAL)]
<del>No Alternate</del> <del>Assessment</del> Instrument	The District shall use only the statewide assessment instrument for the third testing opportunity.
Standards for Promotion Upon Appeal	<ul> <li>If a parent initiates an appeal of his or her child's retention following the student's failure to demonstrate proficiency after the third testing opportunity, the grade placement committee (GPC) shall review all facts and circumstances in accordance with law.</li> <li>The student shall not be promoted unless:0.</li> <li>1. All members of the GPC agree that the student is likely to perform on grade level if given additional accelerated instruction during the following school year in accordance with the educational plan developed by the GPC; and</li> <li>2. The student has completed required accelerated instruction in the subject area for which the student failed to demonstrate proficiency.</li> </ul>
	Whether the GPC decides to promote or to retain a student in this manner, the committee shall determine an accelerated instruction plan for the student for the following school year, providing for in- terim reports to the student's parent and opportunities for the par- ent to consult with the teacher or principal as needed. The principal or designee shall monitor the student's progress during the follow- ing school year to ensure that he or she is progressing in accord- ance with the plan.
Transfer Students	When a student transfers into the District having failed to demon- strate proficiency on applicable assessment instruments after two testing opportunities, a GPC shall convene for that student. The GPC shall review any available records of decisions regarding test- ing and accelerated instruction from the previous district and deter- mine an accelerated instruction plan for the student.

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	If a parent initiates an appeal for promotion when a student trans- fors into the District having failed to demonstrate proficiency after three testing opportunities, the GPC shall review any available rec- ords of decisions regarding testing, accelerated instruction, reten- tion, or promotion from the previous district and issue a decision in accordance with the District's standards for promotion.
Assignment of Retained Students	A student not promoted to the next grade level shall remain at the same campus, if he or she remains in the same attendance zone or shall be assigned to a similar campus setting depending on what is in the best interest of the student.
Reducing Student Retention	The District shall establish procedures designed to reduce retain- ing students at a grade level, with the ultimate goal being elimina- tion of the practice of retaining students. [See EHBC]
